Before the 1989 revolution, Czechoslovakia was a socialist dictatorship ruled by the Communist Party of Czechoslovakia. On 1992, with independence revolution there was the dissolution of the Czech and Slovak Federative Republic.




Bratislava is the capital of Slovakia with a population of around 490,000. Bratislava is the economic, political, scientific and cultural center of Slovakia.

The Slovak Constitution guarantees religious freedom. 68.9% of Slovaks declared themselves Roman Catholic, 12.96% atheist, 6.93% Lutheran, 4.1% Catholic of the Byzantine rite, 2.0% Calvinist, 0.9% Christian Orthodox, while the remaining 1.1% profess other religions.
